New Monopoly set gives everyone the chance to own a stately pile in Kent

On Thursday 1 October, the National Trust launches its very own Monopoly - the first of its kind created for a charity. At £25 for the game, you could be the proud owner of your very own Chartwell (Pall Mall), Ightham Mote (Vine Street), Sissinghurst Castle Garden (Trafalgar Square) or Knole House (Coventry Street).

Twenty six National Trust sites from across England, Wales and Northern Ireland feature in the board game, and all sales of the game go back into supporting the conservation work carried out by the Trust.
